Useful Information

The Conference Venue:

The Conference will be held at the University of Birmingham's public venue in Centenary Square, the civic heart of the city: <u>The Exchange</u> opposite the <u>Library of Birmingham</u> and <u>Symphony Hall</u>.

Travel:

To Birmingham: Birmingham has an international airport connected to the centre of the city by <u>rail</u>, <u>bus</u> and <u>taxi</u>. If you fly into London, you will want to take the train from London Euston to Birmingham New Street. There are two train operators for that route – Avanti West Coast and West Midlands Railway. Avanti West Coast operate a *faster* train (and is more expensive). The faster train takes just over an hour; the slower train takes just over two hours. Rail travel can planned using <u>National Rail</u>.

The centre of Birmingham is walkable, and the city has extensive rail, tram, and bus networks. Details provided <u>here</u>.

The University of Birmingham:

The University is located on a large campus away from the centre of Birmingham, see Google map here. The simplest way to travel from the city centre to the campus is by train. Birmingham New Street to 'University (Birmingham)' is a c.7 minute journey and trains depart every c.15 minutes. There are bus services between the city centre and campus and/or taxis.

The Stuart Hall Archive is held on the campus, at the <u>Cadbury Research Library</u>, in Muirhead Tower – <u>map of the campus</u> – where visitors will also find a Blue Plaque commemorating Stuart Hall.

Accommodation:

The following are not recommendations, but for guidance.

The University of Birmingham has its own campus hotel (Edgbaston Park Hotel – details available <u>here</u>). However, this will require travel to and from the conference each day.
